(6) LINGNAM KNITTING WORKS (222583): 技事之土物.
Now renamed No.2 Rubber Works (設言某事二工土物).
Army clothing and hosiery are produced. 120 workers are employed and another 75 are temporarily laid off drawing 70% of their pay.

Oxygen & Carbide Manufacture:

Due to shortage of electric power, production has ceased at the HONGKONG OXYGEN & CARBIDE FACTORY (223578). The monthly production was formerly 6,000 cylinders of oxygen and about 20 tons of carbide.

(8) Rubber Factory:

The TOKWAWAN Rubber Factory is situated at 22075848.

Formerly known as the HONGKONG Rubber Factory, it employs 6

Japanese and over 100 workers. Daily output is over 400 pairs of rubber shoes for the army, and in addition over 100 retreaded tyres.

(9) Cement Production;

The GREEN ISLAND CEMENT WORKS now only produces cement for the construction of forts in HONGKONG. It works 8 hours daily, and about 100 workmen are employed. Source believes the machinery which was removed from this plant a few months ago was sent to FORMOSA.
